

# Shining a Light on Myrtle Beach's Future: Award-Winning Designer to Brighten Downtown

Myrtle Beach Downtown Alliance understands that lighting plays a key role in this beach community where "after dark" activities are an important driver of the social and economic draw of the community.

Primary aims such as walkability, safety, and visibility are crucial for a downtown community. Myrtle Beach Downtown Alliance has contracted **Leni Schwendinger**, a professional Urban Lighting designer and an expert in light planning with more than 20 years of experience, to connect three key areas of the downtown: The Arts & Innovation District, the beach and the proposed Public Art Corridor.

Lighting plays a significant role in the sense of safety and enjoyment that supports the new and continued evening offerings. Leni's exploration of light has evolved into a profound understanding of the medium, which informs her unique approach across a variety of genres, including infrastructure, landmarks and the ever-changing urban



environment and inclusive of community engagement practice. Her work weaves the dramatic and playful possibilities of light onto the fabric of urban life, sparking an expansion of social interaction and activity in public gathering places.

Leni is an internationally in-demand speaker and considered a pioneer and authority on urban lighting and infrastructure. She is the recipient of numerous professional awards and global media coverage. She directs International Nighttime Design Initiative that includea Smart Lighting Guidance for New York State and developing innovative pilots with think-tank, New Urban Mobility.

Around the world, people have joined Leni in the NightSeeing<sup>™</sup> Navigate Your Luminous City program. These "LightWalks" include Myrtle Beach, SC (October 2022), New York City, Seattle and Portland, USA; London, UK; Bogota, CO; Prague, CZ; and, Sydney, AU to name a few metropolitan locations.
